Star Stacking Stencils

Create gorgeous geometric art!

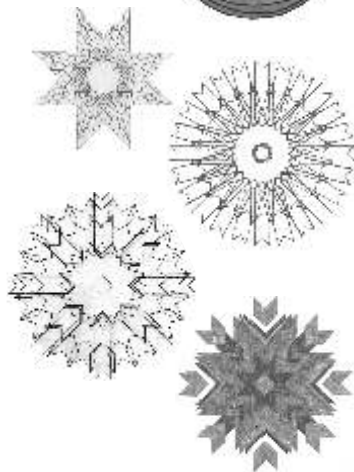
We have created easy to use stencils that produce complex geometric patterns. Here are a few tips to guarantee excellent results:

- Lay a sheet of paper in the plastic tray. Use one small piece of tape to hold the paper in place.
- Experiment with different tracing tools such as pencil crayons, ink pens and gel pens.
- Younger children will find it easier to fill in each cavity with markers rather than tracing around the edges with ink.
- Start with one stencil and trace all of it or just selected elements. Rotate it one notch (15°) or several notches. Trace again. Continue rotating and tracing until the design begins to repeat.
- Try a combination of colors! Trace the entire stencil with one color, rotate and trace again with a complementary color.
- Work with two stencils! Place one stencil over top of the paper in the tray. Place a second stencil over top of the first and trace the exposed areas. Rotate just the top stencil or both stencils to create complex patterns.
- Color in your art work! Use a fine tip pen to create an elaborate design. Once the design is created, carefully color in sections to make outstanding patterns.

• Once you have used up the paper included in the kit, simply trace one of the stencils onto white or colored paper and cut out the square.

• For a larger design, start with a standard 8½ x 11" (21 x 28 cm) or A4 sheet of paper and fold it in half and in half again. Lay the folded sheet in the center of the tray and create your pattern. Flip the sheet over and trace another pattern. Open up the sheet, fold again and trace two more patterns on the remaining blank quarters.

• Use your paper designs to create unique origami paper, greeting cards, memory book designs, stationery, book marks and eye catching posters!



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
